workshop to review items specific to the Bond with the Project Manager Bob Merritt Commissioner Montag opened the meeting and introduced Project Manager Bob Merritt to lead the workshop.

- 1. GIS Mapping Posters The maps depict the response paradigms for each station. The maps show response times from each station given normal traffic conditions. It was noted the maps assume fire fighters are at the station ready to respond. The reality is fire fighters have to travel to the stations, so response times are longer. The maps are color coded to show response times with 8 minutes, 14 minutes and 30 minutes. The geography and road lay out of the district is problematic. One of the maps shows response times out of white Salmon, and highlights how far into KCFD3 the response is.
- 2. <u>Draft Capital Procurement Policy</u>. Merritt has been working with Attorney Brian Snure on a comprehensive purchasing policy. The District was already working on a purchasing policy, but this is far more comprehensive. Commissioners will review it further.
- 3. <u>Capital Purchas Matrix</u>: Chief Long reviewed the proposed purchases. He noted that many of the costs are still estimates due to the time and State mandated requirements

to gather accurate bids. The listed purchase items are divided up by priority and each item meats one or more of the 6 goals of the district. Commissioner Montag requested that the priority designations be explained.

Chief discussed the potential to join with other agencies in the area to work on joint purchase agreements and save money by making group purchases.

There are some items listed in blue. These are items that have been added to the list recently. They have not all gone through a need's analysis, nor have they been assigned priorities, but they have been requested by members to improve response capabilities. (It was noted that an ambulance is listed and needs to be removed and added to the vehicle replacement matrix). There is a chart to show estimated schedule for purchases. There are basic elements that need to be in place. The district is required to maintain a vender list, which is a listing of businesses that we can purchase large items from. We will also need the list for contractors. This is an area the district will need to discuss as we already have MRSC maintain our lists.

Bob Merritt noted that Chief will be heading the capital purchases while Bob Merritt will head up the facilities projects. He cannot launch the facilities projects until the board has clarified the vision and the bed rock pieces i.e. purchasing policy, vendor and contractor lists established. Merritt is not familiar with MRSC and the district may maintain its own list (and drop MRSC).

4. Deployment plan

Merritt handed out a map showing the location of all the local fire district buildings. It was noted that Station 31 is the only station in the area that has acreage to accommodate additional facilities and buildings. For example, it has space at the rear of the building for external training props, and internal space that could be utilized as an EOC.

Merritt asked the Commissioners if they see Station 31 Husum as a "Headquarters Campus"? As such it could function as a support facility for regional fire departments by having storage and training facilities, a workshop for repairing equipment. It could contract to the other agencies to purchase and store PPE, and house a training facility or EOC.

The Commissioners need to decide if this is the right vision for Station 31 in the region. This needs to be decided before Merritt can pursue building planning in earnest. It was noted that while stn. 31 has the largest plot of land it is not the most centrally located (being 7 miles north of White Salmon and hugging the eastern county boarder). Priority should be to get the District response capabilities in order first. Merritt added that, the overall site could accommodate additional buildings, but it would not be part of this capital expenditure. The planning would take into consideration future use not that we would build the facilities now. However, with planning, additional conduit could be placed in the ground and save significant costs in the future.

Eric Bosler asked if this would affect the regionalization plan for the future. If regionalization is the future for the area, then Husum is not the right location. Merritt clarified that this would be for non-emergency services (storage and training etc).

In a catastrophic event the district would be without support for a significant time. Being a self-sufficient facility will be necessary to enable response and sheltering in place.

5. Capital Projects Matrix:

WAC 296-305 – sets out safety requirements for fire stations.

Merritt will be meeting with Klickitat County Building /planning department to discuss areas that will trigger additional building codes. Chief noted that adding sprinkler systems to the stations should be a priority to protect the assets in the buildings, and to set an example in the County.

Merritt walked through the Design & Space Use Matrix with the commissioners. This addresses public access areas, administrative use areas, operations and support services use areas, Residential/personnel areas. The decisions need to be made on how much of the fire station will allow public access.

We need to design space to fit the uses of the district.

Next step will be to go over these items with the members and task force to ensure we get as much input as possible.

We will also be looking for an architect and an engineer. This will require advertising and requesting information and a presentation. The commissioners then chose who they will retain for a 3 year period.

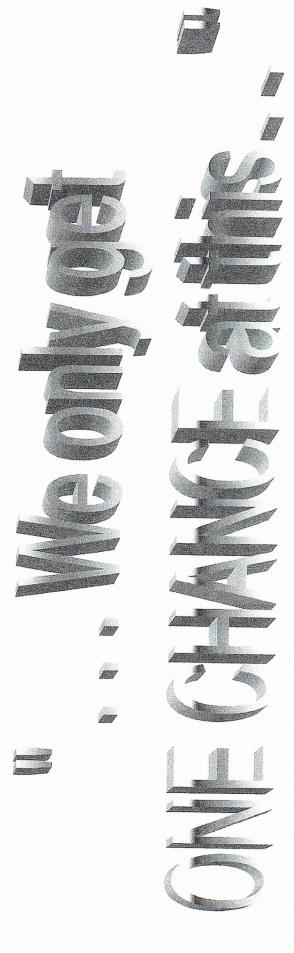
